Continued improvement of organisational governance, policy development, operational efficiency and communications channels to become the trusted provider of:





Annual Report 2021

Revegetation

TreeProject is all about repairing farm land, bushland and urban landscapes with the help of city and urban dwelling volunteers. Following the 30 year tradition, our **ReTree** program grows native seedlings in urban backyards that are planted out in the country. Landholders place their orders with TreeProject and the seedlings are germinated in urban backyards by volunteer growers, nursed through to Autumn or Spring, depending on which distribution has been elected, then planted back in the local areas. New volunteers are provided with training and guided by more experienced volunteer growers, creating a supportive and uplifting grower community.

We received a record number of orders this year and our network of 258 volunteer growers sowed the seed for 68,139 seedlings. This included orders for bushfire recovery, koala habitat and threatened ecosystems. We were delighted to have the support of Hope Lions who grew over 1,300 seedlings as part of a disaster and recovery project for the fire affected area of Corryong. Community spirit was alive and well after recent devastating bushfires with groups keen to do what they could to help. Five Rotary Clubs in East Gippsland joined forces to create the East Gippsland Rotary Fire Aid (EGRFA) Committee. This group of hardworking and passionate volunteers delivered various types of aid to fire affected communities including distributing 2,500 native seedlings to fire ravaged areas of east Gippsland.

TreeProject recognises diversity is important for supporting resilient ecosystems. Our revegetation programs aim to increase the diversity of species we grow for different vegetation types including ground covers, grasses, shrubs and trees. This year the total number of different types of species grown increased from 96 to 136.

Our **Ribbons of Green** program aims to help landowners of the Yarra Ranges restore habitat on their land. Each year the program aims to plant 60,000 seedlings including ground story, flowering shrubs, middle story trees and tall canopy trees. These plantings provide shelter for stock, habitat for local fauna and protect waterways. TreeProject was proud to contribute over 16,000 seedlings this year across 9 properties.



Revegetation

A highlight of the Ribbons of Green program are the volunteer planting days which provide opportunity for urban dwellers to connect with the landscape and rural landholders. Planting days provide the backdrop for new friendships, laughter and the type of satisfaction and wellbeing that only comes from old fashioned hard work.

TreeProject hosted 17 planting days this season with 260 volunteers planting 10,125 seedlings. An outstanding achievement considering COVID interruptions throughout.







The graph shows the numbers of seedlings ordered by landholders each year. TreeProject propagates an additional 30% above these numbers and typically most of these additional seedlings are also planted out.







It has been an extremely busy and productive year for the TreeProject Nursery.

The 2020-2021 season was one of TreeProject's largest in number of orders, consequently it was also one of the largest for the nursery with 5,402 seedlings being allocated for propagation in the nursery.


The nursery began the 2020-2021 growing season by hosting five new grower training sessions – that in itself is an all-time high.

Later in the season the nursery ran transplanting workshops – to give new growers practice and to deal with the backlog of transplanting that needed doing before the weather became too warm.

In the following months and when covid restrictions allowed, volunteers continued to assist with transplanting and growers were able to come and transplant species from the nursery 'back-ups' to fulfill their orders where possible.

During the winter months the sowing and transplanting of winter germinating species has been underway. At time of print a combined effort between the nursery and one of TreeProject's expert growers, Karin G. has the number of transplanted seedlings at 3,100 plus.

Technology

Much of 2020 involved 'dealing with COVID' issues and IT systems were moved to the cloud. In parallel with this, a dedicated volunteer, **Peter Hooke**, updated the 25 year old Access office system. The other major project was migrating to a new website that could process financial transactions automatically.

In 2021, we were able to draw breath and I was able to form a skilled and professional IT team. This consists of **Peter Hooke, David Hack, Nigel Pirie and Belinda McPhee.** We meet weekly with our technology provider, Revium, and plan out the work required.

Our major achievements for 2021 are:

- Implementation of a grower seedling tracking spreadsheet (allows global view of tracking progress)
- Migration of the website into TreeProject hosting (allows full control)
- Addition of monthly and yearly donation options to the website (replaced manual system)
- Connection of web based transactions to the Redback database (to save data entry time)
- Ability to centrally record details of interactions with contacts (new feature)
- Implementation of Order Seedlings form which allows landholder to select from the 400 species offered by TreeProject (replaced paper system and manual invoicing)

There are also a myriad of smaller tasks that are required to keep the operation running smoothly (web updates, web security, development tools, address look up, data for comms, new laptops).

For the future, we'll be looking at improvements in grower seedling tracking and the best way to transition from our 25 year old Access office system to a modern system.

There is plenty of work to do so we are happy to welcome new helpers for the IT team.

Communications

The past year has pleasingly seen a significant increase in communication with TreeProject stakeholders across all channels. The overarching strategy focused on achieving increased brand awareness together with elevated connection and meaningful engagement with the TreeProject community.

The strategy included the delivery of: electronic direct mail campaigns, survey, regular news and event website updates, monthly e-newsletter publications (The Leaflet, started April 2021), social media campaigns and analytic analysis. Social Media content was delivered on a regular basis in an informative and positive manner, recognising and acknowledging significant events and key stakeholders. No paid campaigns were carried out over this reporting period and the communications role was carried out on a voluntary basis.

We aim to further elevate connection and awareness of TreeProject across Victoria to reach targeted revegetation growth and grow engagement. 
