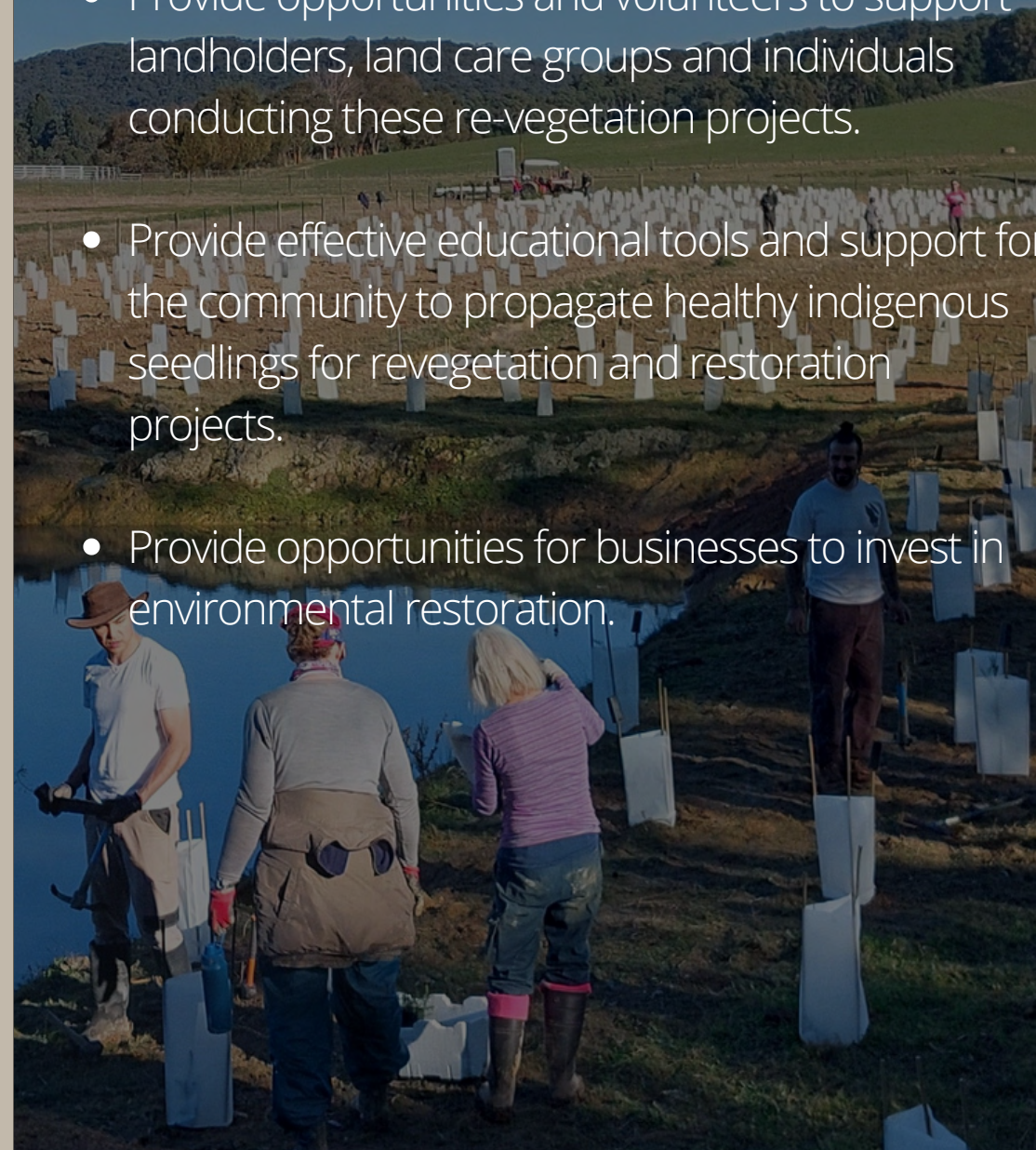

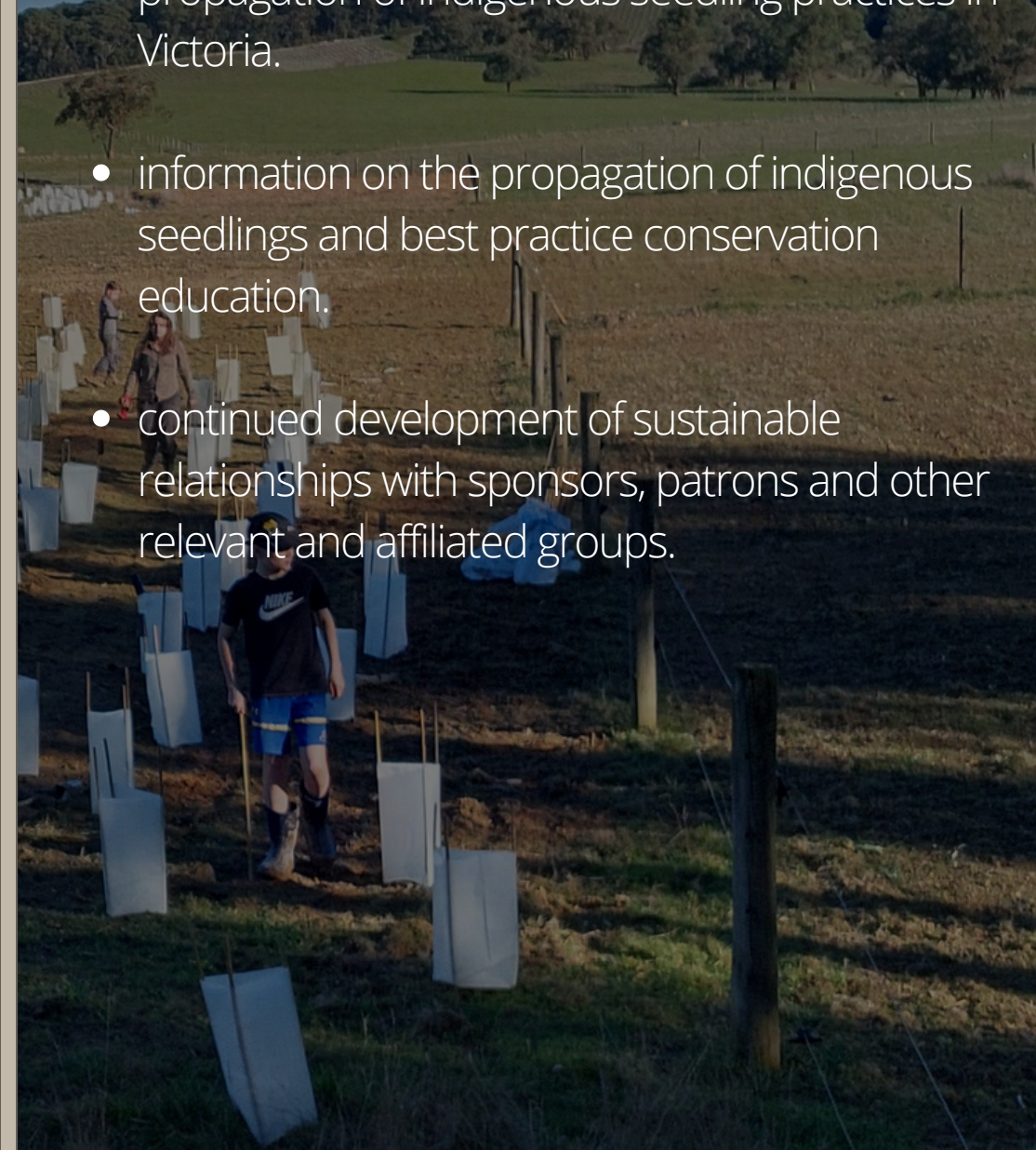

On 5 May 2019, a team of volunteers planted 500 grass, shrub and tree seedlings on this site to commemorate the 30th anniversary of TreeProject.

Since its first planting at Deep Rock in Yarra Bend Park in 1989, TreeProject has grown over 2 million seedlings, enhancing the environmental biota throughout Victoria.

TreeProject is a non-profit, volunteer-based organisation leading the way in sustainable revegetation in Victoria by providing low-cost indigenous seedlings, grown by urban volunteers, to rural landholders.

TreeProject will continue to look after this site to ensure it achieves its objective of becoming a haven for wildlife.

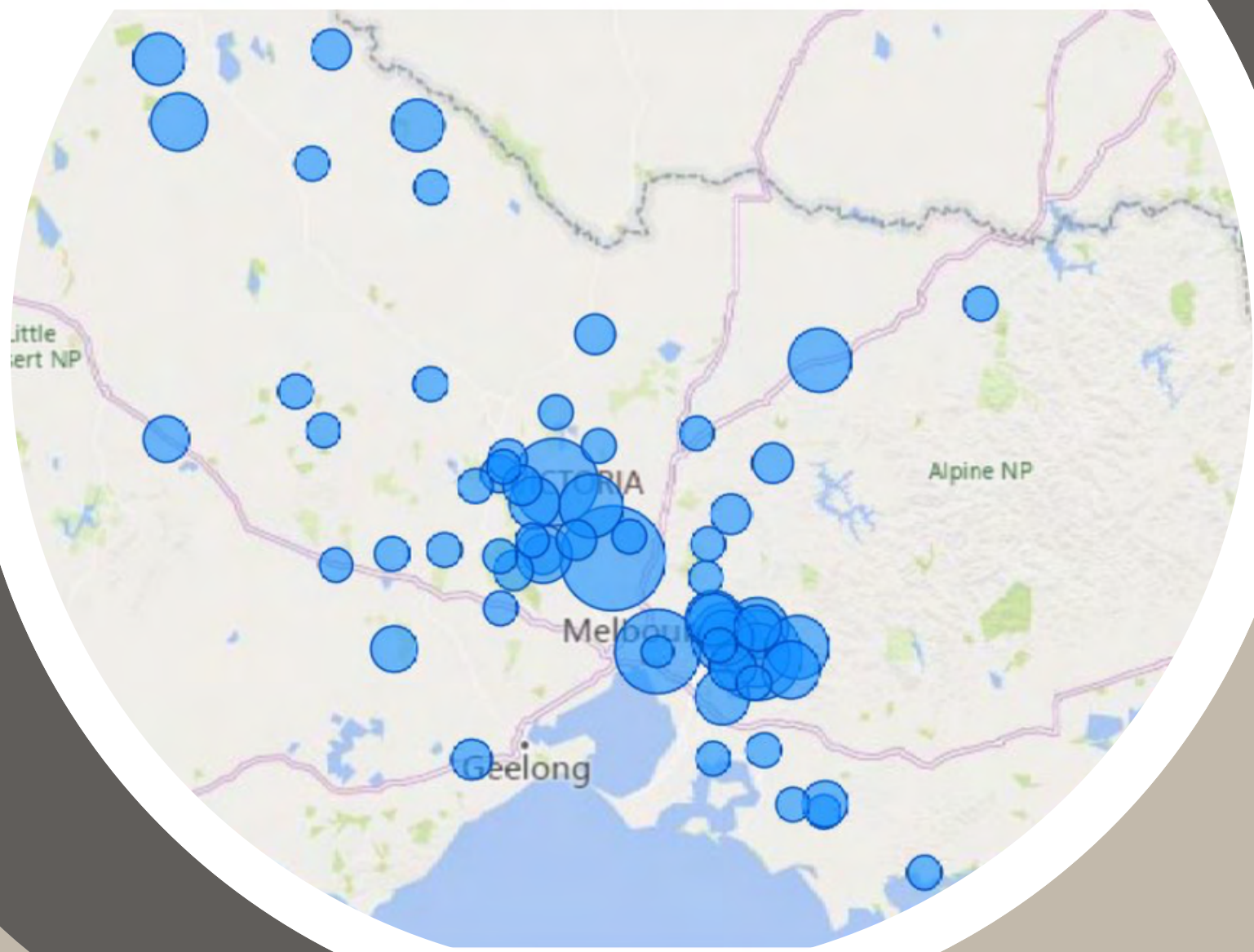

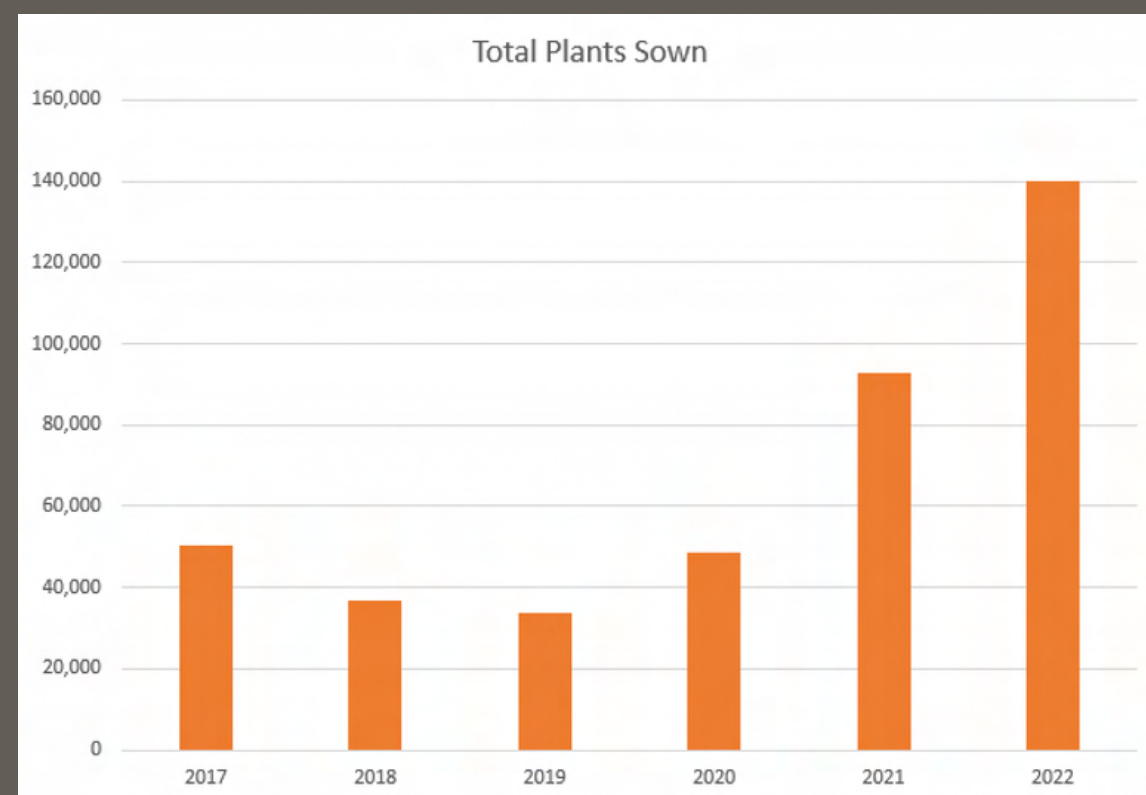

# Revegetation



It is with a deep appreciation that I sit in the Manager's chair to reflect on what an incredible year we have all had. Thank you to everyone for your resilience and support of TreeProject because we simply cannot do it without you.

There is a big thank you to our incredible 373 volunteer growers who grew a massive **141,000** beautiful seedlings, you can tell that the seedlings have been well cared for and we hope it has been a rewarding experience for you. It was a long growing season, thank you for your feedback, we are working on reducing this time period for next season.

Thank you to our Coordinators, these 47 well-organised, experienced growers have done an outstanding job. They are the backbone of TreeProject, giving advice and guidance to our new growers, while supporting our returning growers. We really appreciate your attention to detail.

Talking through the vision of the Landholders is truly inspiring, working together with our team to make that vision come to life is an honour. TreeProject's aim to revegetate, create a sustainable change for landholders at an affordable cost has always been the priority, the cost of seedlings has not increased for a number of years. The Committee of Management has maintained this price to make it accessible for everyone. The cost of supplies has been gradually increasing and as a result, there is a need to review of our costs. This will be conducted in 2022.

Participating in planting days on beautiful properties around Victoria, is definitely one of the perks of the job.

We have had a big team of supervisors this planting season. A huge thank you to Louise for leading the way. Thank you to Jenny Chivers (Committee member), Belinda McPhee (TP, Tech team), Lidija Veljanovsk, Deena Ryan, John Pinniger, Ruby Goldsmith, and Erin Hynd for volunteering. Their time was spent sharing their days with eager volunteers that are sometimes first-time planters, growers who want to plant out the beautiful seedlings that they have grown and experienced growers who just want to plant trees. Thank you to each of you, you bring your personality to each of the planting days, and teach people how to respect and look after our environment.

We had a record number of planting days - a record number of corporate planting groups and individuals this season, we continue to bring the city to the country. Seeing the faces of lots of people whose first time it is to the country, through signing up to attend a planting day with TreeProject, is exhilarating.



Colleagues standing in their gumboots, dirty hands and big smiles on their faces looking back down the paddock with that enormous sense of achievement is a wonderful sight. The comradery between people planting the beautiful seedlings in the rain, wind and of course bursts of sunshine is moving.

The **Ribbons of Green program** which aims to help landholders restore habitat in the Yarra Ranges area is led by Council's Biodiversity Extension Officer, Tim Brown. Tim has been fundamental in incorporating TreeProject into their very successful program, we look forward to another great year with Council.

In the office we have had two additions to the team, please welcome Jessica. TreeProject's Volunteer Administrator, Jess has been with us for three months and has been overseeing the planting days, making sure clear communication is occurring for each of the 44 planting days; the planters have as much information as possible to streamline their day/s, the Landholder knows exactly who and how many people are on their property, and the supervisors have updated volunteer details, site and planting information. Well done Jess! Jess is now organising the grower training days which have started and will continue to the end of the year - until everyone is trained.

A special thanks to all our trainers. Teaching is a special skill, it takes patience and remarkable effort. We take our hats off to each of you who take time out of your day/s to impart your knowledge and share your experiences, thank you. It is very important that all our growers are sowing, the same consistent way.

The other addition to our team is Kathryn, who has been with us for two months and is the new Revegetation Coordinator. Kathryn is super keen and eager to get to know the many pieces of the TreeProject puzzle. Kath's focus has been getting to know Landholders and ordering the seed in preparation for the new growing season. We welcome her to the role.

Another thank goes to Karin for leading the seed packing, Karin's knowledge of seed is supreme and we are very lucky to have her volunteering her time and sharing her knowledge.

TreeProject is very serious about recycling and reusing, a massive thank you goes to the incredible efforts of the depot team who weekend after weekend clean during spring, wash and pack our forestry tubes ready for distribution. This big operation and dedicated group have been meeting here year after year to keep waste down and reduce the amount of plastic purchased – thank you, thank you, thank you.

## From the Nursery

It has been an extremely busy and productive year for the TreeProject Nursery.

The 2021-2022 season saw, yet again an increase in the number of orders for indigenous seedlings, consequently it was another big year for the nursery with, at times up to 5,300 seedlings, in varying stages of growth being held at the nursery.

The TreeProject Nursery began the 2021-2022 growing season by hosting new grower training sessions.

In the following months, volunteers continued to assist with transplanting and root division and growers were able to come and transplant species from the nursery 'back-ups' to fulfill their orders where possible.

For the 2021-2022 season, Alisa, the previous Revegetation Manager, instigated a Spring grower cohort with the Nursery as 'landholder'. These growers provided much needed backup with species that were historically difficult to grow, had low germination rates or needed cooler conditions for germination.

During the 2022 winter months the sowing of winter germinating species has been underway. Once again, one of TreeProject's expert growers, Karin G. has also sown trays of winter germinating species to cover the expected orders.

Finally, a huge thank you to all those volunteers who worked tirelessly to make the 2021-2022 season happen, your commitment is extraordinary and heartening.

# Technology

The IT team continued to meet weekly over the last year. Most of the work is “behind the scenes” but it’s all necessary to keep TreeProject running.

The core group consists of Peter Hooke, David Hack and Belinda McPhee. Tim Shepperd also joined the team in April and has assisted with his expert technical skills.

## **Our major achievements for the last year are:**

- Maintenance of the website and its connection of web based transactions to the Redback database (to save data entry time)
- Updates of Landholder Order Form and Grower Application Form to provide extensive introductory information (users can gain a full understanding of what is required before they sign up)
- Improved messages in confirmation emails with reminders of alternative ways to support TreeProject (membership, donations, volunteering, etc)
- Continuation and improvement of the cloud based seedling tracking spreadsheet (allows global view of tracking progress)
- Major review of the species offered by TreeProject. This included the matching of all species with VicFlora, the alignment of all species related data in the central database (Redback) and the publicly available Web Seedling Database on the TreeProject website. Further work was also completed on the deduplication of photographs and the addition of missing photos.
- Virtual phone system allowing remotely located staff to make can make and take calls as though they were in the office.

There is also a myriad of smaller tasks that are required to keep the operation running smoothly. This cover areas such as web updates, web security, development tools, version control, server and email monitoring, reports, new laptops and support for staff.

A considerable amount of work has been put into the “Systems Uplift” project which will allow TreeProject to transition from our 25yo Access office system to a modern web based app.

There is plenty of work to do so we are happy to welcome new helpers for the IT team, particularly in analysis, development, testing and documentation.

# Communications



The Communications Team are pleased to report that TreeProject communications continued to consistently increase during the 2021/2022 reporting period. Regular input across all channels of communication resulted in a steady growth in brand awareness and connection with like-minded communities (eg: one of our posts reached 2,199 accounts, was shared 51 times and received 88 reactions.)

Strategy to increase brand awareness and engagement included email campaigns, postings to Facebook , Instagram, LinkedIn, analytics assessment, monthly e-newsletter publications - The Leaflet, and relevant website updates.

Over the reporting period, we gained 270 new Facebook Page likes and 149 new Instagram followers. Whilst Facebook reach, page and profile visits remained steady, the estimated number of unique Instagram accounts that saw any of our posts or stories at least once saw a 333.3% increase with a 55.7% increase in the number of profile visits.

Ten editions of **The Leaflet**, our monthly community update, were published over the year. The Leaflet is well received amongst the community receiving an estimated 45.79% open rate (industry standard 30.91%) and 8.51% click rate (4.63% industry standard).

Thanks to Sally Schroeder, Debbie Ho, Rachel Smith, Rhiana Du, Ashana Wicks, Linda & Gina Hogg, who have all made a contribution during the year. The Communication team is 100% volunteer based, and there has been no investment in paid campaigns to date.

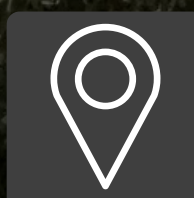

## 4. Acknowledgments

### GRANTS

A significant funding grant of over US\$100,000 has been obtained from **One Tree Planted**. One Tree Planted is a US-based non-profit organisation focused on restoring degraded land through global reforestation.

One of the key requirements of the grant is that TreeProject must monitor seedling growth for 3 years. With this assistance, TreeProject can now become an organisation that propagates, plants and monitors indigenous seedlings. This will allow TreeProject to maintain a deeper relationship with Landholders and will allow an evidenced-based refinement of species suitable for different locations.

### ONE PERCENT FOR THE PLANET

One Percent for the Planet is an international organization whose members contribute at least one percent of their annual sales to environmental causes.

TreeProject has been accredited and is now a 1% for the Planet approved Environmental Partners and is eligible to receive funding from One Percent for the Planet members.
